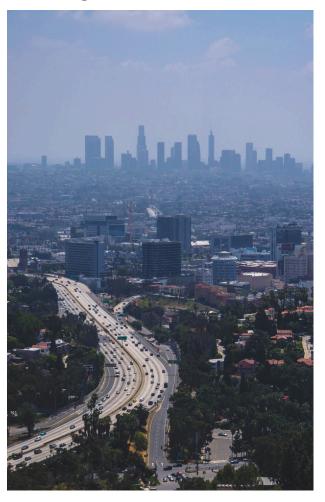
Student Travel Hotspots

Known for its dramatic cliffs, whitewashed houses with blue domes, stunning beaches, and vibrant nightlife.

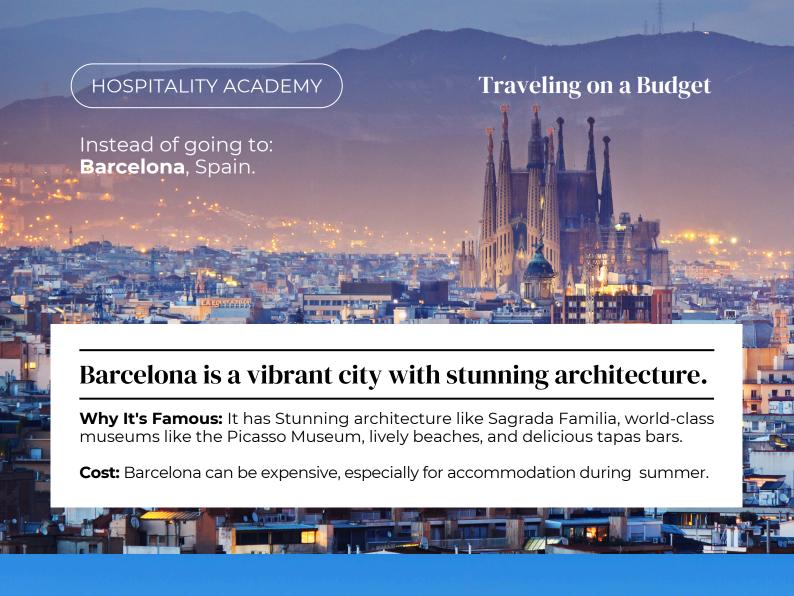
Cost: Santorini can be quite expensive, especially during peak summer. Accommodation, dining, and activities can add up quickly.

Invest in a durable backpack that's comfortable to carry around, preferably one with multiple compartments for organization.

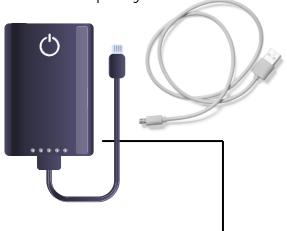
Travel Towel

Pack travel-sized toiletries such as shampoo, conditioner, body wash, toothpaste, and sunscreen to save space and money.

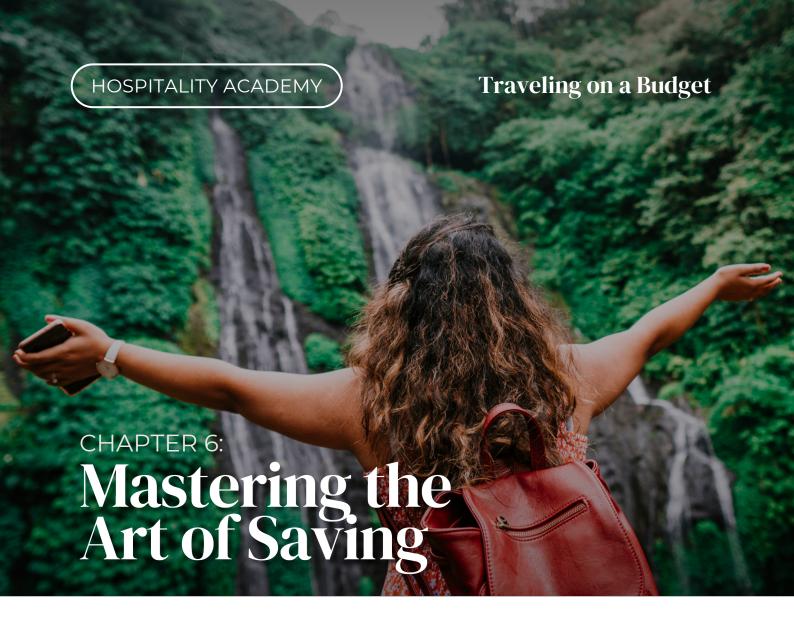
Consider reusable silicone bottles for refilling.

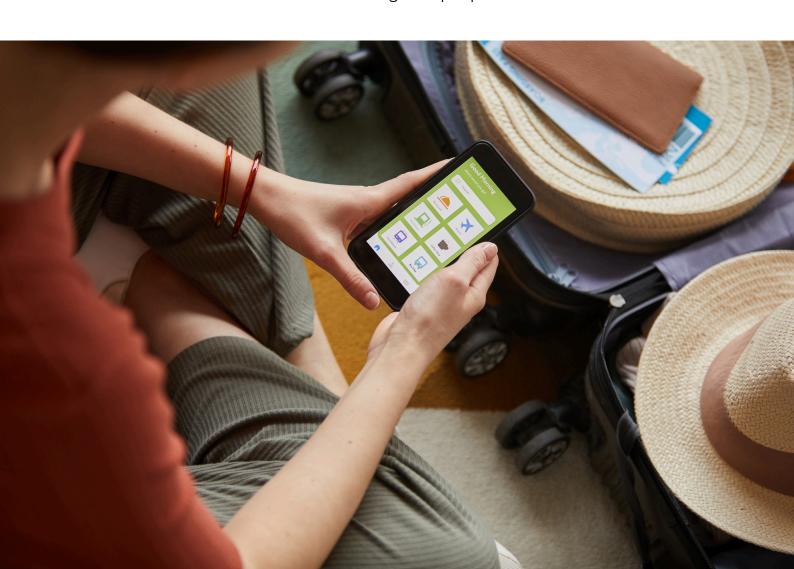
